Week of April 22 through April 28, 2019: 425.3 million gallons, average temperature: 47 deg F, precipitation: 0.00 in.

Week of April 22 through April 28, 2018: 420.8 million gallons, average temperature: 48 deg F, precipitation: 0.06 in.

Week of April 22 through April 28, 2017: 377.6 million gallons, average temperature: 47 deg F, precipitation: 0.31 in.

LOCAL STORAGE:

April 28, 2019 volume is 16.32 billion gallons.

April 28, 2018 was 69.3% of capacity.

April 28, 2017 was 81.2% of capacity.

April 28 normal storage - 1997 to 2001 - is 80.2% of capacity.

April 28 average storage for 30 years - 1981 to 2010 - is 81% of capacity.

There are 247 days of demand in local storage.

SYSTEM STORAGE:

As of April 21, 2019, system wide storage volume is 60.1 billion gallons.

There are approximately 2.5 years of demand in storage system-wide.

System storage is at 71.6 % of capacity.

System storage for April 21, 2018 was 80.2 % of capacity.

System storage for April 21, 2017 was 77.9 % of capacity.

Normal system storage - 1997 to 2001 - for April 21 is 76.1 % of capacity.

Average system storage - 1981 to 2010 - for April 21 is 74.1 % of capacity.
